Dear Parents & Carers,

The day before the You, Me and The Beat Showcase a lovely student walked into my office with shining eyes and an amazing smile asking for Mrs Carter. I informed him that she was busy. His expression changed immediately and in fact, he looked sad. I asked him if I could help. He walked over slowly and whispered into my ear that he wanted to show her something special and explained what it was. I told him I would find Mrs Carter and to come back in 5 minutes. Not only did I locate Mrs Carter but I asked the whole Executive Team to come into my office and wait for the student to return. I knew this was going to be something special, something different that this young student was extremely proud of. The young student arrived with an expression on his face that melted my heart. I would be lying if I said I was not nervous as he walked into my office as I had got an audience together and wondered if he would be upset or nervous himself, especially when he was carrying a didgeridoo that was twice the size of him. He calmly said he could play the didgeridoo and wanted to play it for Mrs Carter.

And what an outstanding performance he gave not only to Mrs Carter but to all of us. Because on the night of the Showcase he was the opening act and shared his beautiful talent with the whole school community.

The young student's name is Jagger Philpott and his talent, his hidden talent was incredible. Jagger first picked up a didgeridoo

in Cairns whilst visiting when he was 8 years old. He learnt to play it with his cousin and didn't put it down for the entire 10 days of his holiday. Six months ago, another of Jagger's cousins gifted him with his own didgeridoo and he has been playing it every day since, mastering it with online tutorials.

I was so proud of Jagger to have the courage to share his hidden talent and when he stepped onto the stage that evening to perform he excelled.

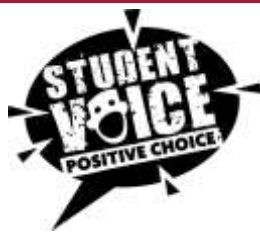

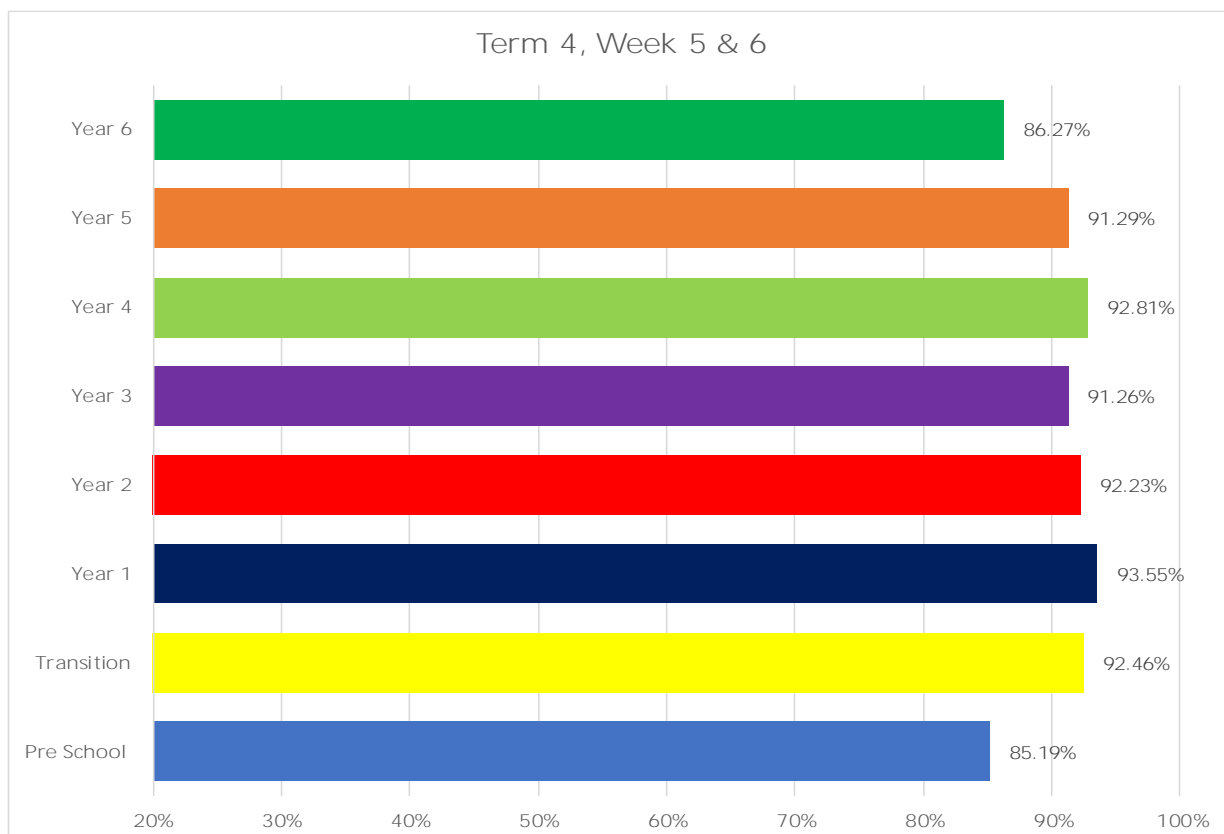
#### **DCO Employment Workshop**
