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Important Notes, Terms and Conditions for Parents

Registering:

- Enrolment is on a *first-in, first-served* basis. Confirmation of Enrolment will be sent out from 5 December 2018.
- Where possible, all students get their first choice. **Online enrolment:** If your first choice option is full then you need to select another option. **Email:** These registrations are immediately transferred to the online booking form. The online enrolment option is the best option to use to get your choice because you know immediately if there is a place available.
- If you miss out on your first choice because the activity is full, select a second choice and then send an email requesting to be waitlisted for the first choice activity.
- Each activity needs a minimum number of students enrolled to enable commencement. The minimum for each activity is 10 students. If, when enrolments close, an activity does not reach the minimum 10 students you will be contacted and have the opportunity to enrol in another activity, if there is space available.
- Parents are to enrol student/s in ONE activity only.

Participation:

- **Weekly sessions will commence Term 1, Week 3, Wednesday 13 February 2019 (2.45pm – 3.45pm) for 8 weeks, finishing on Wednesday 3 April 2019.**
- Once students have enrolled, their attendance each week is compulsory. During the term, if they are absent from the BECA session on three or more occasions without an explanation they will be deemed as having withdrawn from the activity.
- It is a parent's responsibility to organise suitable transport home from school or alternative arrangements at the completion of the activity.
- **Parents must indicate upon registration the method of collection for their child** (whether they walk home, will be picked up from the venue, go to OSHC, etc.)
- **If your child attends Bakewell OSHC, the instructor/teacher will walk them to OSHC.**
- If a session is cancelled, a make-up session will be arranged at a later date and parents will be notified.
- When registering a child to an activity, this indicates the parent/carer is giving consent for Bakewell BECA instructors to teach their child outside of schools hours and place them into the instructor's duty of care.

Payment:

- Payment is due upon receipt of the Confirmation of Enrolment and by the **13 December 2018** to guarantee a place in the activity. If payment is not made by that date, the place in the activity will go to someone on the waitlist.
- **Payment is only required when you have received Email notification of the offer of a place in an activity.**
- BECA will be invoiced to parents in full and cannot be paid in instalments.
- If a student is absent for a session there will be no refunds or make up sessions unless the absence is due to the teacher being away, and a make-up session is not available.
