Dear Parents & Carers,

Week 3 in the term and we are well on the way to a successful year for students and their learning. As I have visited classrooms I have seen evidence of the dedication of students and their teachers towards maximising experiences to create great learning moments and strong teaching and learning classroom communities. This strong start to the year will only strengthen the capabilities of our learners.

I know that some parents and members of the public have been concerned about the Coronavirus and the impact on our community. I urge all parents and carers to keep up to date through reputable sources such as the www.health.gov.au website. The Education NT department are working with the Australian government to send out information that is relevant. Here at Bakewell we will continue to provide this information as it is provided to us, we will use our Facebook page, email mailing list and provide notices in student mail bags. If you are at all concerned about the health of your child or family members then please see your local medical professional.

Our teachers are learners too and have a strong commitment to engaging in professional learning so that they can enrich their skillset with the purpose of enhancing student outcomes. Already this year we have had staff attend professional learning around STEM in the classroom, mathematics and inquiry research (teachers as researchers within our own school). Don't forget that we have our Whole Staff Professional Learning day on the 25th of February where our staff will be learning about how to implement our wonderful new Meaningful Maths pedagogical approach.

Our School Board AGM will be held on **Wednesday the 19th of February at 6pm in the conference room**. You may be interested in nominating for a position on the Board. Expressions of interest close on the 12th of February. I urge all parents, whether or not they have an interest in an official delegation on the board, to become active in the Bakewell Primary School Board. This is a dynamic group of committed parents and community members who are strategic partners in determining the future of education within our school. They work with us to better the educational opportunities for our students.

Speaking of the Board I'd like to take the opportunity to thank them on behalf of staff and students for the beautiful new bus we have in the shed. It is just waiting for its first adventure which will be in the very near future. The bus gives our teachers the opportunity to extend the learning zone for our students without huge financial impact on families.

There have been some changes in our Learning Support program this year. Each class now has at least one support person (depending on needs within the classroom) for our crucial learning times. This means that there is another adult supporting the learning of students until at least lunchtime in each and every classroom. At this stage we are trialing the learning support program as it now stands but initial feedback is that it is going well.

School Counsellor

Hi Bakewell students, families and community,

Although many have already met me, I am Dr Joanne Wicks and I am Bakewell's school counsellor. I have been working at Bakewell since July last year, however, I have worked alongside Bakewell Primary School as a child counsellor for over 6 years. My focus is to help students be ready for and capable of learning. Additionally, I provide support to teachers, families and Bakewell community through consultations and training.

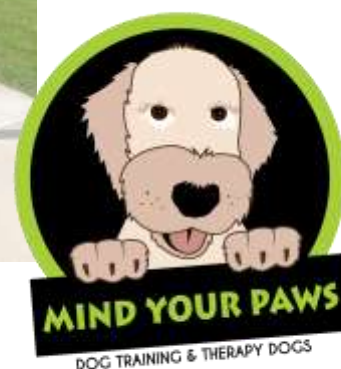
The two main counselling approaches I use are Child Centred Play Therapy (CCPT) and Sandtray. CCPT is an evidence-based child counselling model that is developmentally and culturally relevant for children aged 2-12. This mental health intervention grants children the opportunity to direct their own play and to explore and address their challenges. Sandtray therapy is an evidence-supported, specialised counselling approach for working with children. Sandtray therapy is primarily nonverbal, encompassing the use of sand, miniatures toys, water and a tray.

I provide individual and group counselling, as well as working with whole classes and the whole school on different topics relating to wellbeing. Additionally, my role involves supporting other programs that Bakewell Primary offer. For example, Mind Your Paws which is a therapy dog program aiming to enhance the wellbeing of the students who participate, in the picture below is Harlo, Braiden and myself.

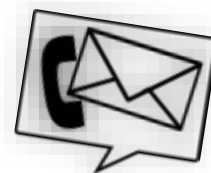

Your child's attendance at school is crucial to their learning. We believe in the philosophy of "Every child, everyday at school is learning."

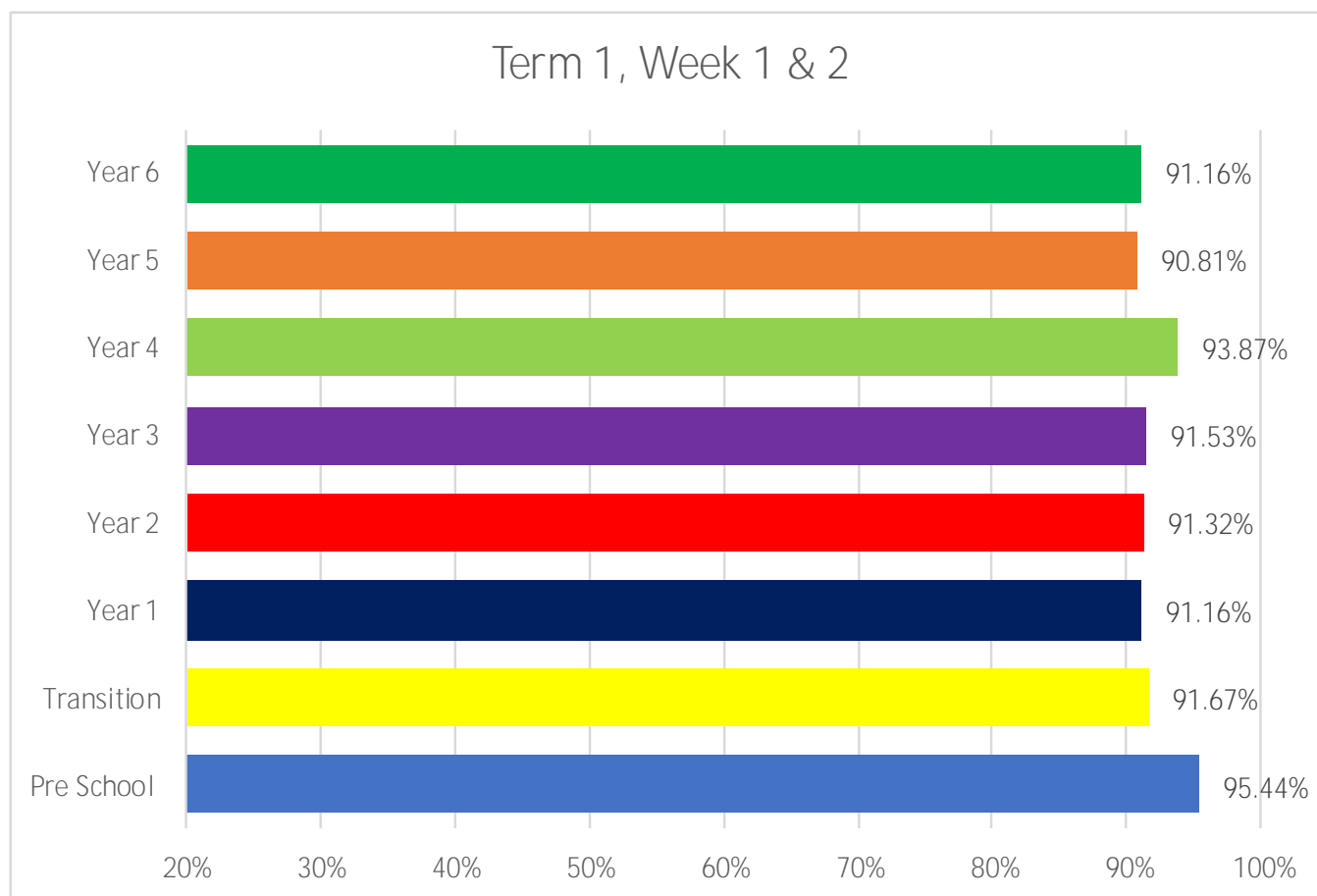

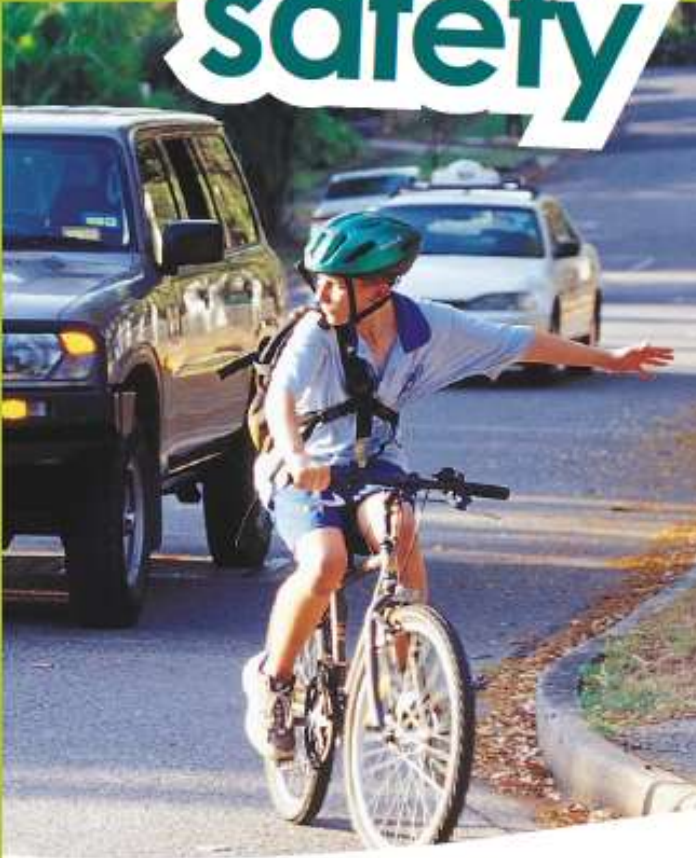
- Jars of all sizes (lots of them!)

**Rules to remember
when riding your bicycle**



Helmets

- For a person under 17 years of age, an approved helmet must be worn at all times while riding, correctly fitted and fastened.
- For a person 17 years of age or older, an approved helmet must be worn, correctly fitted and fastened, when travelling on a road or on a bicycle lane that forms part of the road.
- The above helmet requirements apply to the rider and any person being carried on a bicycle.

Note: An approved helmet is a helmet that complies with Australian Standard AS/NZS 2063.

At all times when riding:

- Keep at least one hand on the handlebars.
- Do not carry more persons on the bicycle than it is designed to carry.
- Do not hold onto another moving vehicle while riding a bicycle.
- Always give hand signals to indicate which direction you are about to travel.
- Do not cause a traffic hazard by moving into the path of a driver or pedestrian.
- Do not carry a load that flaps, sways or overhangs the sides, front or back of the bicycle.
- If you are 16 years old or older, you may carry a person under 10 years in a bicycle trailer if it is safe to do so and the person is wearing a securely fitted and fastened helmet.

When cycling on bicycle paths and footpaths:

- You must keep to the left of any oncoming bicycle rider.
- You can ride on footpaths (unless prohibited by a 'No Bicycle' sign), but you must keep left and give way to pedestrians.
- Use your bell or horn to warn others, especially when riding up behind them.



The Sport Voucher Scheme is available to every school-enrolled child from Preschool to Year 12. Parents or carers need to apply for vouchers online each semester.

Children living in an urban area are eligible to receive two \$100 sport vouchers each year. One in January and one in July, for sport, recreation and cultural activities.
